

Requirements for the Major in History

(Effective Fall 2018)

AP Exams: If you receive a score of 3 or higher on the following AP Exams, you will receive credit towards the following lower division courses: AP US History: 17A and 17B, AP European History: 4B and 4C, AP World History: no class equivalency but yields units.

IB Exams: If you receive a score of 5 or higher on the following IB Exams, you will receive credit towards the following: IB History of Americas: 17A and 17B, IB History of Europe: 4C only, IB History of the Islamic World: HIS 6, IB History of Africa: HIS 15

Transfer Courses: You will receive lower division credit for courses taken at a California Community College based on the articulation agreement between UC Davis and the individual institution. All other transfer courses (including other UC's, CSU's, and out of state institutions) must be approved by the History Advising Department.
